Message from ICC Regional Development Manager – Europe

It gives me great pleasure to welcome all teams, players and officials to Dundee for the ICC European U/ 15 Division 1 Championship.

Similar to last year's event, Europe's top four Associate Members Denmark, Ireland, Netherlands and Scotland will once again be joined by the Channel Island sides Guernsey and Jersey.

Last year's title holders and this year's hosts Scotland, who in 2008 ended Ireland's long eight-year reign as champions of this age-group, will have everything to play for as they look to defend their title from a revived Ireland team set on regaining their number one placing. Meanwhile, Denmark, Netherlands and relative newcomers Jersey and Guernsey will also be keen to add their names to the trophy, and given Scotland's triumph last year, a new title-holder in 2009 is certainly an achievable feat.

For many of the players taking part in the tournament this will be their first experience of international competition and will provide a great opportunity for them to grow and develop as cricketers. This stage also allows players the chance to impress upon their country's selectors and contest for a place in their future national U/17 and U/19 teams and possibly a chance of qualification for the 2010 ICC U19 Cricket World Cups in Kenya (2010) and Canada (2012).

There are many people who have contributed to the organisation of this event, not least the Tournament Organiser Euan McIntyre, to whom the ICC and I are truly grateful. Personally I would like to thank all the match officials – referee, umpires, scorers and web managers; groundsmen; match managers; and many other volunteers who have made all this possible and have worked so hard and kindly hosted matches.

Good luck to all those involved and let's hope the spirit of cricket shines through this week.



Ian Damarell- (Manager): Ian is a veteran of Guernsey cricket having played for Guernsey over many years. He made his County Over 50's debut this year scoring a century at Grainville.

Ben Ferbrache- (Coach): Ben is a member of the senior Island squad and played in World Cricket League 7. He is also a student at Cheltenham & Gloucester University studying sport.

Josh Kirk- (Captain) Right handed batsman and leg spinner: Josh attended the ICC Europe Centre of Excellence in La Manga this winter and has represented Sussex at U14 level this summer. He attends Elizabeth College and plays his cricket for PwC Academy in the C.I. League.

Joe Alvarez- Right handed batsman and right arm seamer: A talented player Joe scored the first junior century in Guernsey cricket this year. A talented batsman and sharp seam bowler he will be looking to build on his experiences with last years U15 team in Jersey.

Ben Cuddihee- Right handed batsman and right arm seamer: Ben is an athletic seam bowler who has worked hard over and performed well in domestic junior competitions. He attends Elizabeth College and plays his domestic cricket for Corinthians and GCB Emerging Players.

Issac Damarell- Right handed batsman and wicket keeper: Zac has pushed on with his cricket nicely in 2009 and has opened the batting for the PwC Academy in the C.I League this summer. He will be a key play for Guernsey in the tournament. Zac plays his cricket for Optimists and GCB Emerging Players and Academy teams.

Will Garnett- Right hand batsman and off spinner: One of the teams most experienced bowlers, Will has performed consistently in Guernsey cricket from junior cricket through to senior domestic cricket. His excellent fielding and economical bowling make him a key member of the squad. Will attends St Sampsons High and plays his club cricket for GCB Emerging Players and Cobo.





Tom Hutchinson- Right handed batsman and leg spinner: One of three brothers involved in Guernsey cricket Tom gets his first taste of European cricket this year. A canny leg spinner and clever batsman Tom plays his cricket for GCB Emerging Players and Salemites.

Dane Mullen- Right handed batsman and right arm seamer: Guernsey's leading wicket taker at the 2008 U15 tournament in Jersey and another key player. Dane attends St Sampsons High and plays his club cricket for GCB Emerging Players and Cobo.

Ollie Nightingale- Right handed batsman and leg spinner: Ollie played a couple of games in the U17's last year performing admirably, whilst having a strong year at age group level. He plays his cricket for GCB Emerging Players and Corinthians.

Harry Player- Right handed batsman and wicket keeper: A hard hitting batsman and wicket keeper Harry shows enormous potential and hits the ball as cleanly and hard as most adults. He plays for Corinthians and PwC Academy.

Matthew Stokes- Right handed batsman and right arm seam: Matthew made his Sussex debut at U13 level this year and joins up with the U15's for this tournament. A solid batsman and consistent right arm seamer he brings a lot to the squad.


Oliver Tapp- Right handed batsman: An elegant right handed batsman and excellent fielder Ollie has batted consistently all year in domestic and representative fixtures. Ollie is a student at Elizabeth College and plays for St Saviours and GCB Emerging Players.

Nick Waldron- Right handed batsman: Nick was a key member of the 2008 U15 squad in Jersey and has performed well in 2009. He plays his club cricket for Corinthians and GCB Emerging Players.

Robert Woodhard- Right handed batsman and right arm seam bowler: Robert has been one of the best seamers in domestic cricket this summer hitting an excellent length and being very economical. His dogged batting may well come in handy during the tournament.









Alex Cooke (VC Colts)

Talented opening bowler and left handed batsman who has made good progress this year playing for his club. This is Alex's second U15 tournament having featured in Jersey in 2008.

Charlie Fricker (Sherbourne school)

Charlie is also playing in his second U15 tournament and will be hoping to make an impact in all aspects of the game having enjoyed a successful season away at school in the UK.

Finlay Hare (VC Colts)

Finlay is a right handed top order batter and medium pace bowler who has represented both Jersey and the Channel Islands in several county tournaments in the UK.

Paul McCafferty (Springfield)

Paul is a good all round cricketer and lightning fast fielder who will be representing Jersey in an International tournament for the first time.

Matthew Collin (Optimus)

Matt has emerged as an off spinner who is capable of taking wickets at senior club level. One of several talented cricketers at Optimus CC, Matt is travelling overseas to represent Jersey for the first time.

John Tardivel (VC Colts)

John plays an important role in our side as a batsman who this season has shown responsibility and put together some big innings. John is quick between the wickets and has also represented Jersey on the football field and will probably be one of the first picks in the post match five asides!





Oliver Johnson (VC Colts)

Oli represented Jersey in this tournament at home last year and will be looking forward to building on his experience from 2008. This top order batsman and leg spin bowler will again be looking forward to the challenge of European Division one.

Callum Rabet (Farmers-Caesereans)

Callum is a top order batsman, medium pacer and dynamic fielder. Having put in some solid performaces for his club this season in the weekend league, Callum will be hoping to put together some big innings at the top of the order. This is Callum's first taste of European cricket.

Brother of Charlie, Ed is one of three U14 players to be selected in the Jersey squad. Ed bowls medium pace and bats in the top order and will be looking to contribute in all aspects of the game.

Tom Sutton (Uppingham School)

Another U14, Tom has enjoyed a busy season of cricket away in the UK. Having impressed with the gloves at the Arabian Challenge festival in Sussex in 2008, Tom will be one of two wicket keeper batsman in the squad.

Jake Dunford (VC Colts)

Jake is another wicket keeper who has benefitted from playing regular weekend league cricket for his club VC Colts. Jake has worked hard this year and will hope also to contribute runs when given the chance with the bat.

Daniel Garton (VC Colts)

Dan is a talented batsman who will be hoping to bat for long periods of time when he gets his chance. Dan is also a good body boarder who has represented Jersey in big events in the past.

Luke Gallichan (VC Colts)

Luke is the Jersey U14 captain who this year has enjoyed success for both club and school with the bat and ball. Luke will be hoping to continue this form in Dundee in his first European tournament.
